

NORMAN HYAMS

1966-2024. Lived and worked in London, UK.

Norman Hyams scrutinised everyday life through enigmatic and highly personal paintings and sculptures. Often working from photographs of his past that intrigued him, Hyams reworked them into a series of recurring motifs that dance the line between daydream and memory, a process he described as 'teaching himself how to see'. Often it is the good, the bad and the ugly of growing up in London's east end that was reflected in his evocative portraits of boxing tournaments or cropped tennis-courts, spectacles frequented as a teenager and cherished for their lasting cinematic intensity. Captured in feverish light brushstrokes or crisp, contemplative colour-fields, these snapshots stand shoulder to shoulder with vignettes of childhood party scenes, a lover standing forlorn at the dressing table, rows of stoic suburban houses, or sanguine landscapes of Greek island holidays. Together his work contrasted the boisterous and nocturnal energy of the city with solemn and inward-looking scenes, evoking the intensity by which particular memories - both real and imagined - come to hold significant emotional resonance and meaning in our lives. In each case a history is told, a narrative beckoned.
