

STEVIE DIX

Stevie Dix makes uncanny paintings composed in a personal language where figures and symbols are metaphors for intimate feelings and, at times, political perspectives. Her work moves from thick and heavy oil strokes to washed-out stains of canvas that wane and contrast with dark emotional realism. Raised in an ex-industrial town in Belgium, her hard-edged and vivid urban scenes are filled with references to post-war Belgian crafts, post-punk fashion, rebellious nightlife and enigmatic or withdrawn female figures. Influenced by the Belgian Surrealists such as René Magritte, Rachel Baes or Jane Graverol as much as American animator Suzan Pitt or German-Jewish artist Charlotte Salomon, Dix's uncanny exploration of cultural identity is at once deeply introspective, existential and passionate. Her abstracted and eidetic vignettes speak to a confluence of memory with the subconscious, the mundane with the fantastical, and capture the intensities of our daily lives from coming-of-age drama to psychological domestic scenes, in each case laced with the fleeting, and at times longing desire to escape.
