Natalia González Martín's work explores the symbolic aspect of objects and their veneration through a contemporary visual language of still life, renaissance portraiture and religious iconography. Inspired by a mixture of her iconodule Catholic upbringing and a fascination with the history of Western mythology, her work explores the myriad ways in which both religious symbolism, allegory and fables represent deeper truths about ourselves and society, but also the myriad ways in which they have been used to establish and uphold patriarchal narratives about the limits of female desire, creativity and freedom. Bringing together ancient and contemporary worlds, from Ovid's *Metamorphoses* to art history from the Counter-Reformation, contemporary popular culture to subtle imprints of her own personal experience, Martín's work illustrates the symbolic mutability of love, passion and power throughout the ages.
