

SANDRA POULSON

b. 1995, Angola. Lives and works in London, UK, and Luanda, AO.

Sandra Poulson takes the cultural, political and socio-economic landscape of her home country Angola as a case study for the analysis of the relationship between history, oral tradition and global political structures. Focusing on the contrasting architectures, livelihoods and infrastructure of contemporary Luanda, Poulson's draws heavily on personal research and inherited societal memories of colonial Angola and its civil war. Working principally with highly detailed hand-crafted fabric patterns alongside crude materials such as soap, dust and other mixed media - as well as drawing, printmaking, performance and video - her work calls attention to values of labour, class, urban space and exchange, often exploring informal economies and the interplay between contemporary modes of extraction, production and survival.
